Governor Jane Hull appointed me to an eight-year term on the *Arizona Board of Regents* in 2000. I chaired all of ABOR's major committees, with particular emphasis on auditing, academic affairs, capital resources, and developing the UA College of Medicine's Phoenix campus. As part of my presidential agenda (*Focused Governance, 2004-2005*), I led a major restructuring of board and staff committees, governance focus, and IT capacity. I modified the underlying relationship between the board and its many university stakeholders, and served on two related boards, *Arizona Technology Enterprises, LLC*, (2002-2008) and the *Translational Genomics Research Institute*, (T-Gen-2004-2008). I am still active in a few ABOR related activities, including *Solutions for Higher Education*, and ongoing committee membership regarding the *Phoenix Biomedical Campus*.

I spent a good deal of time between 2004 and 2008 helping to advance the medical education and research missions of the *University of Arizona's College of Medicine*—Phoenix campus, in partnership with *Arizona State University*. Governor Janet Napolitano appointed me to the *Arizona Commission for Medical Education and Research* in 2004, which led to the infrastructure and legislative support enabling the UA's second medical school campus in Phoenix in 2006. Because one of the major areas of my law practice at Jennings, Strouss & Salmon had centered on medicine and health care issues, ABOR has asked me to play an active role in advancing medical research, bioscience initiatives, and development funding for the universities. In that capacity, I continue to maintain close relationships and affiliations with many of Arizona's research stakeholders, including board and leadership roles with the *Arizona Cancer Center*.

As part of my job as the Senior Policy Advisor to the Office of the Dean at the *Sandra Day O'Connor College of Law* at ASU, I give policy advice, strategic direction, and management assistance regarding facilities and public relations. I worked on solutions for funding, design/building, management, and stakeholder participation in moving the law school from ASU Main Campus (in Tempe) to ASU Downtown Campus (in Phoenix). “Nobody Did Anything Wrong But Me—State of Arizona v. Steven Edward Jones

Northern Arizona University—Mass Shooting—2015 to 2020.” Twelve Tables Press, Fall 2021. Nonfiction. Steven Edward Jones was for first-degree premeditated murder, second-degree murder, manslaughter, and three counts of aggravated assault and battery. He went to trial on April 4, 2017. The jury could not agree on a unanimous verdict and the judge ordered a mistrial on May 2, 2017. Two and a half years later, Jones agreed to change his plea. He pleaded guilty to one count of manslaughter and three counts of aggravated battery on January 9, 2020. He was sentenced to serve six years in the Arizona State Penitentiary. He will be released in 2026. The book is narrative nonfiction, encompassing the shooting, arrest, investigation, trial and ultimate conviction of Jones and resolving the civil case against him, his family, and their gun company. The manuscript covers the local consequences of the first and only mass shooting at NAU. And it defines America’s national epidemic of gun violence, especially on American campuses. The narrative back-story is how America’s gun culture harms victims, families, the criminal justice system, and the rule of law.
